

## **2021 Entry Rules**

## **DEPARTMENT 15 — HOME PRODUCTS**

- All products must be made from scratch by the exhibitor within the last calendar year (September 2020 to August 2021). Premiums will not be paid for commercial products.
   Baked goods must be brought to the fair in or on disposable plates or containers. No glass plates will be accepted. Management will not be responsible for return of plates or containers. Baked products should be packaged in Ziploc bags that can be sealed to protect against dryness. No baked goods needing refrigeration will be accepted.
- 3. All baked products entries become the property of the Hookstown Fair and will not be returned to the exhibitor. After judging, the fair may display only a portion of the product for the week.
- 4. All exhibitors must follow General Rules and Regulations.
- 5. Only one entry per class per exhibitor will be accepted (including other).

### **SECTION 1 — BAKED PRODUCTS**

Baked products are to be judged on flavor, lightness, general appearance and crumb. Pies are judged on texture of crust and flavor consistency of filling. All baked products must be displayed in disposable containers.

Contestants entering yeast related baking classes are encouraged to use RED STAR® Yeast. If used please attach an empty packet or photo to their recipe entry. Those that attach the packet will be eligible to win prizes from RED STAR®. Prizes for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> consist of insulated tote bag, instant read thermometer, and a tea towel. All participants will receive packets of yeast and coupons.

- Canned fruits and vegetables to be judged on quality, general appearance and container.
   Canned foods must be exhibited in standard Mason-type, clear glass canning jars using a two-piece self-sealing lid (flat discs with metal screw band). Metal screw band must be left on for exhibition because all jars may be opened. All others will be disqualified by the judge.
   Canned items for exhibit must be canned after last year's fair.
   Personal names on canning jars will not be accepted. Contents and date may be on label.
   Only one kind of bean may be entered in each class.

- 4. Entries in the baking contests may be entered Monday, Aug. 23<sup>rd</sup> from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. Entries will be accepted by the Special Baking Committee located in the bottom of the Grange but put on display in the commercial building across from the Main Stage.
- 5. All entries must be displayed in disposable containers. No glass containers will be accepted.
- 6. All judging will begin at noon on Monday, Aug. 23rd.
